Please be advised that each institution of higher education designates fourteen legal holidays per calendar year to be observed by all its employees. When the efficiency of operations dictate a temporary closure, the Chancellor will schedule campus closures. For Chancellor Closure Days not part of the fourteen day holiday schedule (e.g. Lundi Gras), all twelve-month employees are expected to earn and use compensatory leave (comp time) or annual leave. Employees who do not have accrued vacation or compensatory time off to cover scheduled Chancellor Closures must charge the time to leave without pay. However, employees who do not have available leave to cover the Chancellor Closure day should first work directly with their supervisor for special assignments to be used to negate the need for leave without pay.
